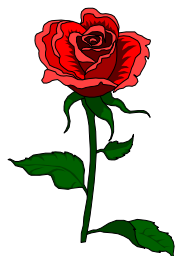

<p>Philanthropy Update</p> <p>Trophy Club Philanthropy Committee visits</p> <p>SafeHaven Women's Shelter</p> <p>Marion Hawker, Chair</p>	<p>On June 11th, our Philanthropy Committee visited SafeHaven in Fort Worth. Reece Small, Vice President of Development and Marketing, and Valerie Salter, Special Events Coordinator, were our hosts. They gave us a tour of the facility and shared a lot of information on the services provided to their clients. The shelter in Fort Worth can accommodate around 72 people and usually fills up more quickly in the summer. SafeHaven also has a shelter in Arlington that can accommodate 102. With the kids out of school, mothers tend to be more serious about leaving behind their abusive environment. Once they are admitted to the shelter, often in the middle of the night with just the clothes on their backs, they are assigned a case manager who helps them get access to a wealth of resources including job search opportunities. The average length of stay varies between a few weeks up to about a month. Typically, a safe place is found within 30 days; however, they can stay in the shelter if necessary. Once a level of financial stability is achieved, transitional living options are available. SafeHaven also offers school programs such as SafeDate, which teaches healthy dating relationships; for elementary school children there are programs in coping with bullying classmates. Many volunteer opportunities are available for those who would like to donate some of their time. This includes assisting with children's programs, preparing and serving meals on the weekend, and much more. On behalf of Reece, Valerie and the TCWC Philanthropy Committee, a heart-felt thanks to all the ladies who gave so generously in preparation of our visit. We filled two cars with clothes, shoes, toiletries, books, etc. Everything was very welcome and will be put to good use.
